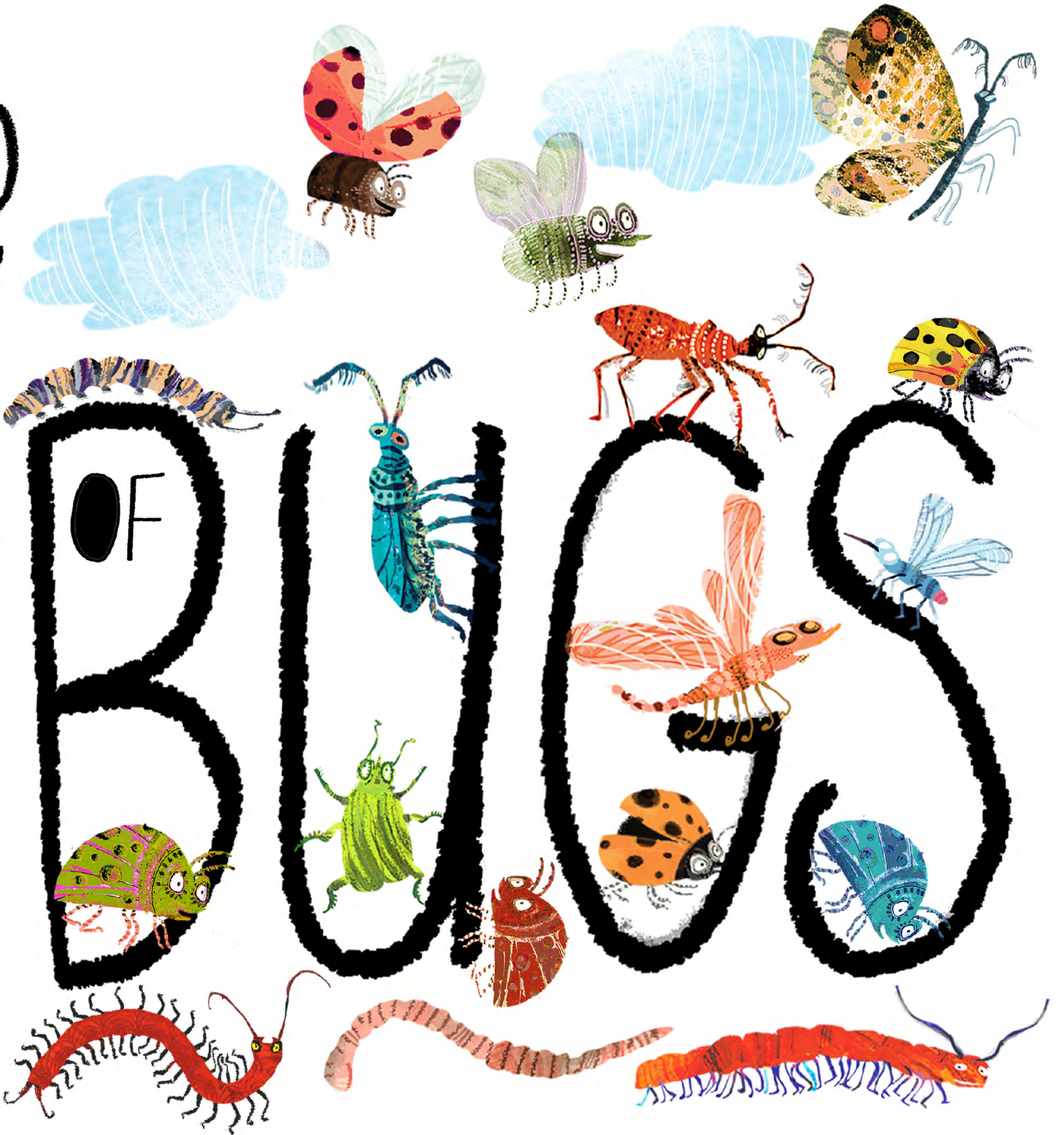


HOW TO DRAW ALL KINDS

by Superfly Freddie!

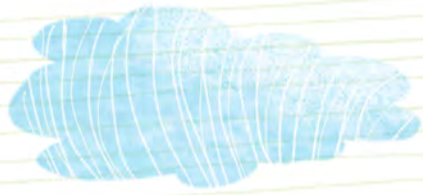


WHAT YOU'LL NEED:

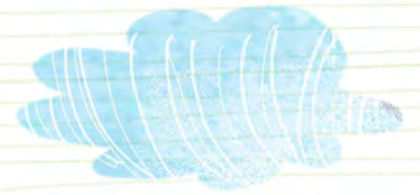
Whatever is already in your pencil case!

half-circle shape

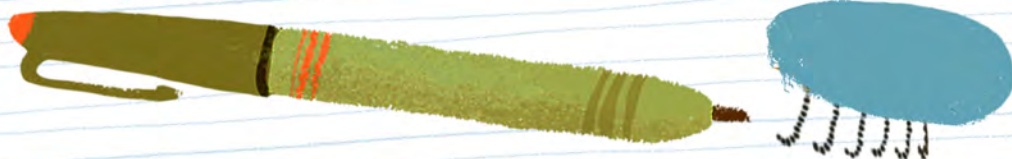


squiggly shape



*Spiders have 8 legs, but we're not doing spiders... (Freddie hates them!)

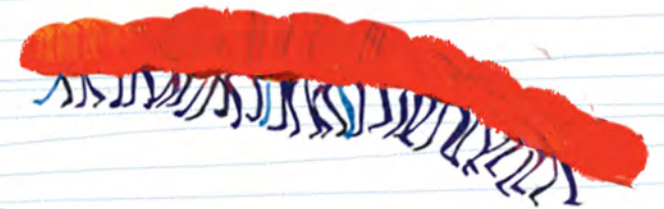
This is the ONLY part where you'll need to COUNT!

Insects all have 6 legs



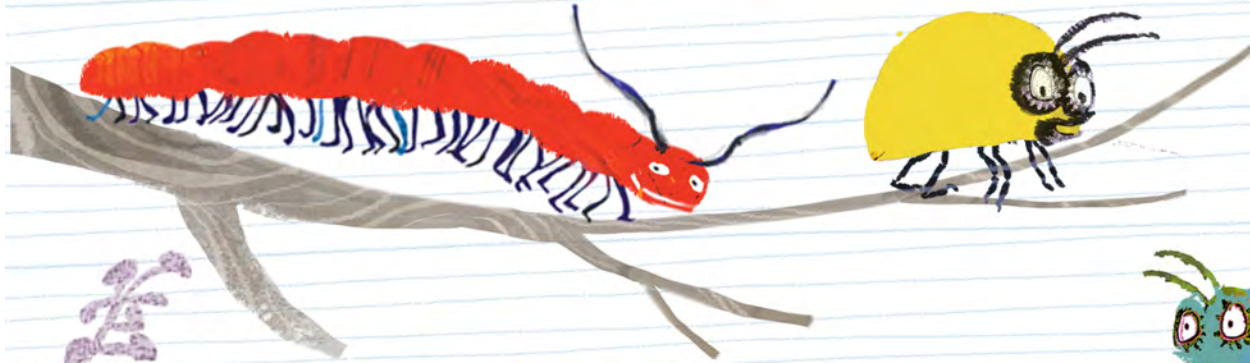
Worms have NO legs

So use pale colours and add white lines.
