

Cute Extras

Flowers

- Roll tiny balls for flower centres.
- Add small petal shapes around the centre.
- Attach near the door, windows, or base.

Bees

- Roll a tiny oval body.
- Add thin wrapped stripes.
- Felt on two tiny flat wings.
- Place near flowers or on the cap.

Mini toadstool step

- Make a tiny stem and cap.
- Attach beside the door as a fairy step.

Ladybirds

- Roll a tiny round ball and flatten slightly underneath.
- Add small dots and a line down the centre.
- Place on the stem or cap.

Stone path

- Roll several tiny wool balls.
- Flatten slightly and attach in a line leading to the door

Snails

- Roll a small ball for the shell.
- Add a thin coiled spiral on top.
- Felt a tiny sausage shape underneath for the body.
- Place near the base or door.

Chimney

- Roll a tiny tube and attach to the cap.
- Add a soft wisp of wool above for “smoke”.

Vines & leaves

- Roll thin wool strands and gently twist.
- Felt them climbing up the stem.
- Add tiny leaf shapes along the vine.

Needle Felted Mushroom Fairy House



You will need:

- Needle felting wool in any colours you choose
 - Wool for: stem/house, mushroom cap, details
- 1-2 felting needles (coarse for shaping, fine for details if available)
- Foam mat or felting pad
- Optional: finger guards

Finished size: approx. 3-4 inches (8-10 cm) tall



Safety reminders

Always stab straight up and down

Work slowly and keep fingers clear of the needle

When working on small elements use a cocktail stick, pencil or another needle to hold felt in place whilst you felt with your needle so that your hands are safe

Step-by-step instructions

1) Make the stem (the house body)

- Take a large handful of wool and roll it loosely into a short sausage shape.
- Place it on the foam mat and stab all over to start firming it.
- Shape it so the bottom is wider and the top is slightly narrower.
- Keep turning and felting until it is firm and stands upright.
- Stem height when finished: about 2–2½ inches.



2) Make the mushroom cap

- Take another large handful of wool and roll it into a ball.
- Gently flatten it into a dome shape.
- Felt the top and sides until it holds its shape.
- Add thin wisps of wool around the edge and felt them in to create a wider overhang.



3) Attach the cap

- Place the cap on top of the stem and adjust until it looks balanced.
- Wrap a thin strip of wool around the join (use a colour already used or a contrasting colour)
- Felt through the strip into both pieces until firmly attached.



4) Add a door

- Roll a small piece of wool into a flat oval or rounded rectangle.
- Felt it flat on the mat, turning it over to firm both sides.
- Place it on the stem and felt around the edges to attach.
- Add a tiny wool ball for a door knob if desired.



5) Add windows

- Make one or two small flat shapes.
- Felt them onto the stem.
- Add thin wool lines for frames or window panes if you like.

6) Add mushroom cap spots

- Roll very small balls of wool.
- Place them on the cap.
- Felt gently, mainly around the edges, so they stay slightly raised.



7) Add grass or moss

- Pull small wisps of wool.
- Place them around the base of the stem.
- Felt lightly so they stay soft and textured.

8) Final shaping

- Gently felt over the whole house to smooth loose fibres.
- Check joins and details feel secure.
- Adjust shape until happy.



Your mushroom fairy house is complete!

Each one will be unique - perfect for imaginative play, seasonal displays, or gifting.
